ISTANBUL TO ATHENS ABOARD *SEA CLOUD*
JUNE 27 TO JULY 5, 2015

Dear Members and Friends of The Commonwealth Club,

The Mediterranean, which Homer called “the wine-dark sea,” played a pivotal role in the trade and cultural exchange between the peoples of its shores. This summer, explore this region aboard the privately chartered *Sea Cloud*, slipping into small harbors and shallow bays to visit some of the most important sites of antiquity.

Traveling with us will be Professor of Philosophy Rebecca Goldstein and language specialist and Professor of Psychology at Harvard, Steven Pinker. We will also be joined by Dr. Joan Aruz, Curator in Charge of Ancient and Near Eastern Art at The Metropolitan Museum of Art.

In Istanbul, admire the city of the Ottoman sultans, whose palaces recall those of the great empires of antiquity, before embarking the elegant *Sea Cloud*. From the port of Izmir, drive to the site of Sardis, capital of the ancient kingdom of Lydia. Then sail to the Greek isle of Samos, with its celebrated Temple of Hera. On Santorini, explore the site of ancient Akrotiri, and stroll in the picturesque clifftop village of Fira. Finally, explore two extraordinary sites on Crete—the Minoan palace at Knossos and the Greek site of Eleutherna. An optional prelude in Istanbul and postlude in Athens are also offered.

Rebecca Newberger Goldstein received her Ph.D. in philosophy from Princeton University and is currently Visiting Professor of Philosophy at the New College of the Humanities, London, UK. She is the author of ten award-winning books, the latest of which is *Plato at the Googleplex: Why Philosophy Won't Go Away*. Professor Goldstein is the recipient of numerous awards, both for her works of scholarship and her novels, including a MacArthur prize, popularly known as the “genius” award, which she received in 1996.



Steven Pinker is an experimental psychologist and one of the world's foremost writers on language, mind, and human nature. Currently Johnstone Family Professor of Psychology at Harvard University, he has also taught at Stanford and MIT. He has received seven honorary doctorates, several teaching awards, and numerous prizes for his books. Dr. Pinker often writes for *The New York Times*, *Time*, and *The New Republic*. He has been named in *Time* magazine's “The 100 Most Influential People in the World Today.”

Built in 1931 for heiress Marjorie Merriweather Post, the four-masted yacht *Sea Cloud* has hosted royalty, served her country during World War II, and sailed the world. Experience the thrill of traveling aboard this legendary lady in an ambiance of relaxed elegance.

We are sharing this journey with members of The Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Carnegie Museums of Pittsburgh. I hope you will join us on this exceptional voyage!

SAILING THE MEDITERRANEAN IN THE AGE OF ODYSSEUS ISTANBUL TO ATHENS ABOARD *SEA CLOUD*

June 27 to July 5, 2015



AT SEA

Monday, June 29 During a relaxed day at sea, attend a lecture and watch as the ship's crew trims the sails by hand. Weather permitting, there will be an opportunity to swim in the Aegean. This evening, join the captain for a welcome dinner.

IZMIR, TURKEY

Tuesday, June 30 Step ashore at Izmir and drive inland to the site of ancient Sardis, capital of Lydia. The city was ruled by the legendary King Croesus, whose reign is credited with the invention of gold coinage. Sardis was later ruled by Persians, Byzantines, Romans, and Turks, and most ruins date from the Roman era. Following lunch on board, enjoy time at leisure in Izmir.

SAMOS, GREECE

Wednesday, July 1 This morning *Sea Cloud* calls at the island of Samos, which in the 8th-7th centuries B.C.E. developed into a marine trading center with connections from Egypt and the Near East to Spain in the west. Discover the Temple of Hera and view artifacts from its excavation at the Archaeological Museum. Numerous votives of international character were found in the sanctuary, as well as two colossal *kouros* statues.

SAN FRANCISCO

Saturday, June 27 Depart on an overnight flight to Istanbul.

ISTANBUL, TURKEY | *SEA CLOUD*

Sunday, June 28 Arrive in Istanbul this morning and join your fellow travelers during lunch at Pera Palace Hotel. Visit the Byzantine Church of the Savior in Chora with its exquisite mosaics before boarding *Sea Cloud* in the late afternoon. Enjoy a champagne toast on deck as we cruise out of the harbor of Istanbul and into the Sea of Marmara.

SANTORINI, GREECE

Thursday, July 2 Be on deck this morning as *Sea Cloud* sails into the bay of Santorini, one of the world's most astounding geological sights. In the 16th century B.C.E. a volcanic eruption caused the center of the island to sink, creating a vast caldera of striated rock, rising 1,000 feet from the sea. Explore Akrotiri, one of the most important prehistoric settlements of the Aegean. After lunch on board, there will be time at leisure in the dazzling white town of Fira, perched high on the cliffs overlooking the harbor. This evening, dinner is served on deck as we sample the fine wines of Santorini.

CRETE, GREECE

Friday, July 3 Arrive at Heraklion on the island of Crete for a morning visit to the site of Knossos, political center of the Minoan civilization and legendary abode of the Minotaur. Then tour the newly renovated Heraklion Archaeological Museum, housing exceptional examples of art of the Minoan era and the age of Odysseus. Continue by coach to the site of ancient Eleutherna, with treasures that illustrate the interaction of Crete and the Near East in the age of Phoenician expansion. Rejoin *Sea Cloud* in the port of Rethymnon, where the ship remains overnight. Explore the charming Old Town, whose architectural influences range from Venetian to Ottoman.

Saturday, July 4 Spend a leisurely day at sea as *Sea Cloud* sails from Crete toward mainland Greece. This evening the captain hosts a festive farewell dinner.

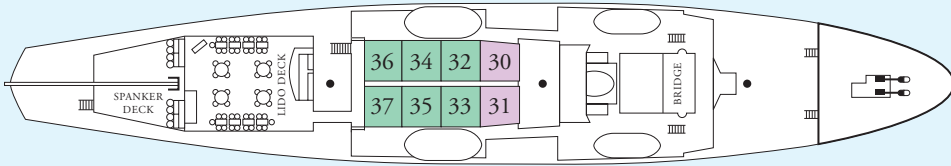
Sunday, July 5 Disembark *Sea Cloud* this morning in Piraeus and transfer to the Athens airport for your flight home. ■



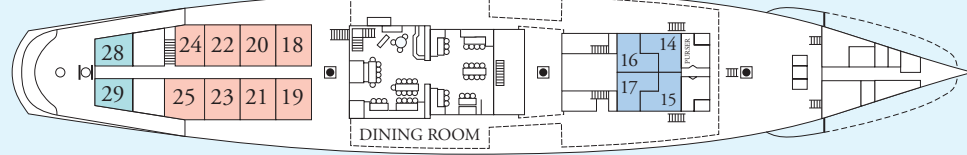
The Acropolis of Athens

SEA CLOUD ■ DECK PLAN

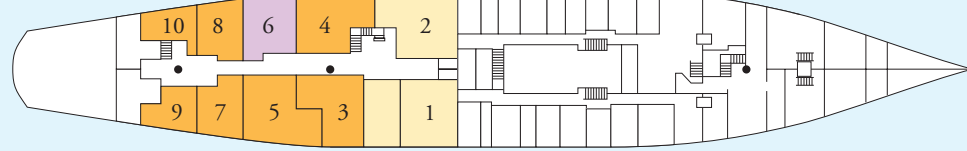

OPTIONAL ISTANBUL PRELUDE

June 24 to 28, 2015

Spend three nights in this fabled city, capital of three empires. View exquisite Rüstem Pasha Mosque, rarely seen by foreigners, and browse in the Spice Market and Grand Bazaar. At the Archaeological Museum, marvel at the Alexander Sarcophagus, from the 4th century B.C.E., and tour the recently restored Museum of Turkish and Islamic Arts. Explore legendary Topkapi Palace, where the sultans lived for four centuries; the Blue Mosque, with its splendid cascade of domes; and the basilica of Hagia Sophia, built a thousand years before St. Peter's in Rome. Accommodations are at the historic Pera Palace Hotel. ♦

OPTIONAL ISTANBUL PRELUDE \$1,895 per person. Single supplement \$795. Includes three nights at the Pera Palace Hotel; breakfast daily, one lunch, and two dinners; sightseeing as noted.

OPTIONAL ATHENS POSTLUDE

July 5 to 8, 2015

Disembark *Sea Cloud* in Piraeus and spend three nights in Europe's oldest capital. Ascend the Acropolis to explore the Parthenon and visit the superb new Acropolis Museum. Drive to Delphi whose evocative ruins include the Temple of Apollo, and visit the Delphi Archaeological Museum.



Peruse the 8,000-year panorama of classical civilization on display at the National Archaeological Museum and discover the unique collection of the Benaki Museum, housed in a former private mansion and encompassing all periods of Greek history and culture. Accommodations are at the legendary Hotel Grande Bretagne in the heart of Athens. ♦

TERMS & CONDITIONS

AIRFARE Academic Arrangements Abroad (AAA) will be pleased to assist with air travel arrangements for this program, including specially negotiated group airfare when available, suggested flights, or individual requests for a processing fee of \$40 per person. Complete details will be provided in your confirmation mailing.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE A deposit of \$2,500 per person, payable to *Academic Arrangements Abroad*, of which \$350 is non-refundable for administrative fees, is required with the reservation application. Final payment, by check only, must be received 120 days prior to departure.

HEALTH All participants must be in good health. This program involves extensive walking over uneven surfaces, climbing stairs at monuments and other locations not handicapped accessible, and climbing in and out of various conveyances, including tenders. Any condition that may require assistance or special medical attention must be reported at the time of your reservation. PLEASE NOTE: *Sea Cloud* does not have an elevator.

INSURANCE TRIP CANCELLATION / EMERGENCY MEDICAL EVACUATION / BAGGAGE / ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE PROTECTION IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED. CANCELLATION PENALTIES ARE STRICTLY ENFORCED. The Commonwealth Club (CC) will send an insurance application upon receipt of reservation and deposit, although you may select any insurer of your choice.

CHANGES IN ITINERARY & COSTS The itinerary is subject to change at the discretion of CC and AAA. All prices quoted are based on prevailing fuel prices, airfares, and currency exchange rates in effect at time of brochure printing and are subject to change without notice. Deviations from the scheduled itinerary are at the expense of the individual.

RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE The participation of CC is limited to educational sponsorship of the program described in this brochure (The Program). The passage ticket issued by the carrier is the sole contract between the participant and the carrier. Nor will AAA or CC and / or their agents be responsible for loss, injury, damages, or expenses to persons or property, due to illness, weather, strikes, local laws, hostilities, wars, terrorist acts, of nature, or other such causes in connection with The Program or anything beyond their reasonable control. AAA is not responsible for transportation or other program delays and changes, nor additional expenses or loss of time that may be incurred. In the event it becomes necessary or advisable for the comfort or well-being of the participants, or for any reason whatsoever, to alter the itinerary at any time, without notice to the participants, such alterations will be made without penalty to AAA or CC. Additional expenses, if any, shall be borne by the participants. Baggage and personal effects are the sole responsibility of the participant at all times. AAA and CC reserve the right to accept or decline any person as a participant at any time, or to require any participant to withdraw from The Program at their own expense when such an action is determined by AAA or CC to be in the best interest of the participant's health and safety, or the general welfare of the other participants.

CANCELLATION POLICY AAA must strictly adhere to its cancellation policy to offset costs incurred prior to the commencement of The Program, which may include but are not limited to: advance payments to land operators; ship charters; communication expenses; development / promotional expenses and the loss of time that might have permitted resale of reserved space. All cancellations must be made in writing to the offices of AAA and are subject to a \$350 non-refundable administrative fee. All refunds are limited to amounts actually received by AAA and are the sole responsibility of AAA; CC shall have no liability for refunds. At the time AAA receives written notification of cancellation, the following cancellation charges will apply: cancellations received between 120 and 91 days prior to departure, 20 percent of the program cost per person; those received between 90 and 61 days before departure, 50 percent of the program cost per person; no refunds will be given for cancellations received within 60 days of departure. No refunds are given for cancellation on or after the day of departure, or for unused portions of the tour, for any reason. Air cancellation charges, if any, will be assessed in accordance with airline regulations. All group fare tickets must be issued no less than 30 days prior to departure. NOTE: Neither AAA nor CC shall be liable for any airline cancellation penalties incurred by the purchase of a non-refundable ticket. In the case of a cancellation due to shortage of participants, AAA will attempt to notify all participants at least 45 days prior to departure. However, AAA reserves the right to cancel The Program prior to departure for any reason and, in such case, reimbursement of refundable costs of the trip by AAA shall constitute full settlement with the participant. In the unlikely event that a dispute arises between a participant and AAA or CC, the following conditions will apply: (a) the dispute will be settled by binding arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in New York, NY; (b) the dispute will be governed by New York Law; (c) the maximum amount of recovery to which a participant shall be entitled under any and all circumstances will be the sum of all monies actually received from the participant by AAA.
