From the Smithsonian Institution, Janetta Rebold Benton, Professor of Art History at Pace University, New York. She has lectured at the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Smithsonian, and has served as the lecturer on trips world-wide for both institutions. A former resident of Paris, she recently returned from St. Petersburg, Russia, where she was Visiting Professor in the Graduate School of Art History at European University as a Fulbright Senior Scholar. Dr. Benton is the author of eight art history books as well as numerous scholarly articles. She holds degrees/diploma from Harvard University, Brown University, George Washington University, and Cornell University.



From Harvard University, Susan Rubin Suleiman, Professor of Comparative literature. She holds her B.A. from Barnard College and her Ph.D. from Harvard University, and has been on the Harvard faculty since 1981. She served as Chair of the Department of Romance Languages & Literatures, and as Chair of the Department of Comparative Literature. Suleiman is the author or editor of numerous books and articles on contemporary literature and culture. She has held a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Rockefeller Humanities Fellowship, and several NEH Fellowships. She has also served as an elected member of the Executive Council of the Modern Language Association from 1993 to 1996, and as Vice-President and President of the American Comparative Literature Association from 1995 to 1999.

Crossroads of Civilizations



The turquoise waters and emerald coasts of the French and Italian rivas have long enticed the Greeks, Etruscans, Phoenicians, Romans and Germanic peoples. The beau monde began flocking to the seaside towns as de rigor of the 19th-century "Grand Tour" to rejuvenate in the salubrious climate. The rise of Italian nobility—particularly the Savoy, Italy's ruling family from 1861 to 1946, and the Grimaldis, the lineage of the current Prince of Monaco—further influenced the development of these gems nestled between the Alps and the sea. The Côte d'Azur's radiant quality of light captivated Pablo Picasso, Henri Matisse and Marc Chagall, distinctly influencing each artist's use of brilliant colors, while the glamour of the region attracted great writers like Ernest Hemingway and F. Scott Fitzgerald.

Rome, Italy

Once the center of a vast empire, this UNESCO World Heritage site is today the historic heart of Italy. From the iconic Colosseum and the Vatican, to the Spanish Steps and the Catacombs, the remains of ancient Rome still humble modern visitors.

Costa Smeralda, Sardinia

Sardinia's Costa Smeralda ("Emerald Coast") features remote seaside villages, glamorous villas, a rugged landscape rising from exquisite white sand beaches, and azure waters plied by sleek luxury yachts. Anchor at Golfo di Aranci near Porto Cervo, a haven for celebrities.


On the morning tour, visit the well-preserved granite Nuraghe Albuiccu, one of the Bronze-Age fortresses unique to Sardinia.

Bonifacio, Corsica, France

Dock in the ancient town of Bonifacio, overlooking the sparkling harbor from sheer white limestone cliffs at the southern tip of the island of Corsica.

Cinque Terre

From Porto Venere's small harbor, board a private boat cruise and dock in the villages of the Cinque Terre. This UNESCO World Heritage site is a series of five fishing villages with lovely pastel homes clinging to remote cliffs that jut into the Ligurian Sea. Discover the spectacular nuances of the towns of

This beautiful port's fundamentally French character bears a strong Italian imprint, manifest in the islanders' French-Italian dialect. Transfer by small train for a walking tour through the medieval Old Town. Stroll the Rue des Deux-Empereurs, where Charles V and Napoleon once lodged, and see the Gothic Church of St-Dominique and the famous Grain de Sable limestone formation.

Florence, Italy

Enjoy the rolling Tuscan landscape of vineyards and cypresses en route to Florence, birthplace of the Renaissance. This iconic UNESCO World Heritage site is a treasure trove of unparalleled achievements in art, architecture and literature. During the walking tour, admire Brunelleschi's soaring dome; Ghiberti's moving "Doors of Paradise," depicting scenes from the Old Testament in cast bronze; and Michelangelo's *David*, considered one of his crowning achievements.

Pisa/Lucca

The beautifully preserved medieval cities of Lucca and Pisa are a short, scenic drive from Livorno. Tour Pisa's famous Piazza dei Miracoli, a UNESCO World Heritage site, showcasing the legendary Leaning Tower and visit the impressive 11th-century Duomo and the largest baptistry in Italy. Walk along Lucca's intact Renaissance city walls, now a promenade for pedestrians, and see its elaborate 11th-century Cattedrale di San

Riomaggiore, Manarola and Vernazza, linked by a walking path that offers marvelous views of the charming coves, hidden beaches and terraced vineyards that produce the famous dessert wine Sciacchetrà.

Portofino

Portofino is the perfect village for a leisurely afternoon on the Italian Riviera. Visit the 17th-century San Giorgio Church, home to the relics of this dragon-slaying saint; stroll the pedestrian-only streets; or sip a cappuccino in an outdoor café.

Monte Carlo, Monaco

The principality of Monaco's dazzling historic district, Monte Carlo, offers an intoxicating mixture of princely sights and *Casino Royale* intrigue, and is famous for its Grand Casino. Admire the legendary belle-époque architecture and enjoy a walking tour on the Rock of Monaco. See the changing of the guards at the Prince's Palace, home of Europe's longest-reigning dynasty, and the neo-Romanesque Cathedral of St. Nicholas, where Princess Grace is interred.

Nice, France

One of the oldest human settlements in the world with archaeological sites dating to the Lower Paleolithic period, Nice remains rich in its traditions and centuries-old culture. This capital of the Côte d'Azur is bursting with the colors that inspired Chagall and

Picturesque at any angle, Italy's colorful Cinque Terre is a lovely sight from the sea, while each of its five terraced villages offers breathtaking views of the Ligurian coastline from the shore.

BARCELONA POST-CRUISE OPTION

Carcassonne

Settled on the frontier between France and Spain along ancient trade routes linking the Atlantic with the Mediterranean and Iberian Peninsula, the medieval core of Carcassonne, a UNESCO World Heritage site, has been occupied since the sixth century B.C., fortified by the Romans, conquered by the Visigoths in the fifth century, overrun by Persians in the seventh century, and repelled centuries of invading Franks and hordes of Barbarians, who each left their indelible influence on the extraordinary architectural and artistic heritage of the city. Walk the cobblestone streets and admire the drawbridges and watchtowers. Visit the Musée des Beaux Arts, the iconic castle, and the beautiful Basilica of St. Nazaire to enjoy the joyous ringing of bells that evoke the gothic and medieval past of Carcassonne.

Barcelona, Spain

The lively and beautiful quarters of Barcelona are filled with the artistic treasures of Dali, Gaudí and Picasso, and Europe's greatest concentration of Gothic architecture.


Matisse: the azure waters of the Mediterranean, terra cotta roofs, ocher and yellow houses, emerald green gardens, budding flower markets and marbled tile squares of Baroque and French theaters.

Visit the Musée Marc-Chagall, home to the largest collection of the artist's works, including the 17-canvas *Biblical Message*, and enjoy a walking tour of the Old Town, featuring Nice's famous outdoor flower market.

Cannes

Settled as a fishing village by monks, Cannes today is the quintessence of dazzling Riviera allure and host of the international film festival. See the picturesque, palm-lined La Croisette promenade which leads to the medieval lanes, churches and castle of Le Suquet. Visit nearby Vallauris, where Pablo Picasso discovered his passion for ceramics. Also, see the bay of Golfe-Juan, where Napoleon Bonaparte landed after his escape from exile and began his 100-day reign that ended at Waterloo.

Prince Ranier III's palace overlooks the Mediterranean from the 200-foot-high Rock of Monaco.
